Saint and sinner

Sarah Balkin, Lecturer in English and Theatre Studies at the University of Melbourne, shares her notes on one of the most renowned and produced playwrights of the 19th and 20th centuries.



scar Wilde was born in 1854 to the Dublin oculist and ear-surgeon Sir William Wilde and the poet and Irish nationalist Jane Fingal O'Flahertie Francesca Elgee, Lady Wilde, who wrote under the name Speranza. He studied at Trinity College Dublin and then Oxford, where he earned a First in Greats (now called Classics).

In December 1881 Wilde sailed for America, where he gave a successful lecture tour on subjects including 'The English Renaissance,' 'The House Beautiful,' and 'The Decorative Arts' Wilde's tour introduced the American public to the aesthetic movement, which prized 'art for art's sake,' resisting the idea that the value of art is dependent on moral purpose. The tour also launched Wilde as a celebrity aesthete.

Wilde married Constance Lloyd in 1884. They lived in London and had two sons, Cyril and Vyvyan. During the early years of his marriage Wilde wrote widely, including journalism, critical essays, and short stories. In 1886 Wilde met Robert Ross, who is believed to have been his first male lover. Ross remained Wilde's friend throughout his life and became his literary executor. The Picture of Dorian Gray, Wilde's only novel, was first published in Lippincott's Magazine in 1890. In 1891 he met Lord Alfred Douglas, nicknamed Bosie, who became his lover.

The 1890s saw Wilde's maturity and success as a playwright, with productions of Lady Windermere's Fan (1892), A Woman of No Importance (1893), An Ideal Husband (1895),

and The Importance of Being Earnest (1895) mocking and delighting high society audiences in London's best theatres. Rehearsals of his decadent Salomé, starring Sarah Bernhardt, were halted in 1892 when the Lord Chamberlain banned the play on the basis that it was illegal to depict biblical characters on stage; it finally premiered in Paris in 1896.

Despite the society plays' popularity, many critics pointed to elements Wilde borrowed from other French and English playwrights as evidence that he had not yet mastered the form. Wilde did borrow shamelessly; in 1893 he bragged, 'Of course I plagiarise. It is the privilege of the appreciative man.' To dismiss Wilde as a plagiarist is to miss a

fundamental aspect of his writing, which transformed what it borrowed. This is particularly true of the society plays, which imitated high society in a way that displayed its many hypocrisies, and which deployed and departed from stereotyped plots to make audiences question their moral structure.

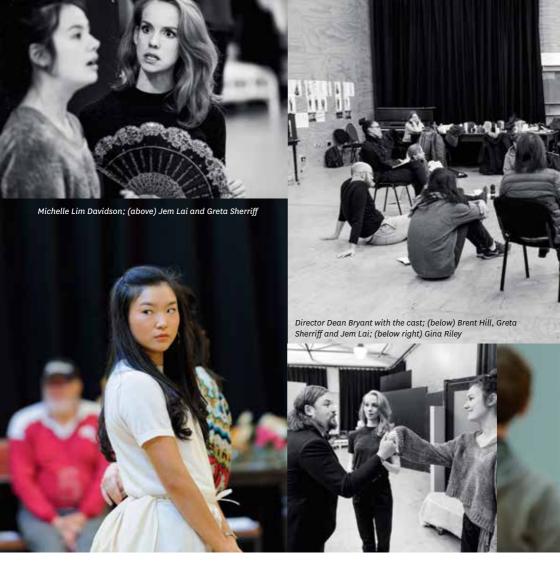
An Ideal Husband invokes and transforms two of the fundamental principles of nineteenth-century melodrama: the duality of good and evil and the exposure of truth. Lady Chiltern represents the melodramatic position with her moral absolutism and insistence that there is no difference between public and private life.

The play's more compassionate moral arbiter, the 'flawless dandy' Lord Goring, guides her to nuance her worldview. Thus, in some respects the play reinforces Robert Chiltern's claim that 'public and private life are different things,' but its tolerance for a degree of moral compromise across both spheres bespeaks its modernity.

Wilde's own private life became a public scandal in 1895, when An Ideal Husband and The Importance of Being Earnest were both playing to large audiences.

On 28 February the Marquess of Queensberry, Lord Alfred Douglas's father, left a card for Wilde at the Albemarle Club that read, 'To Oscar Wilde, posing [as a] Somdomite' (sic). Wilde sued for libel but Queensberry was acquitted. On 5 April Wilde himself was arrested on charges of 'gross indecency.' Although the first jury could not agree, a second trial was ordered and on 25 May Wilde was convicted and sentenced to two years' imprisonment with hard labour.



Even before the conviction, Wilde's name was removed from the hoardings of both theatres, and soon the plays themselves were taken off. The first revival of *An Ideal Husband* in 1905 was euphemistically described as 'by the author of *Lady Windermere's Fan.*'

Wilde wrote a long letter to Douglas while he was imprisoned; it was later published as *De Profundis*. On 19 May 1897, Wilde was released. He lived abroad, plagued by debt and health problems until his death from meningitis on 30 November 1900. During this period he wrote *The Ballad of Reading Gaol* under the name C.3.3., his former cell number.

An Ideal Costume

Set and Costume Designer Dale Ferguson found inspiration for *An Ideal Husband's* 33 costumes in the portrait paintings of 19th century American artist John Singer Sargent. Six months of planning, sourcing, buying, designing and making, with an expanded team of 18 MTC wardrobe staff, and the help of Assistant Costume Designer Sophie Woodward, has brought Ferguson's vision to life.



Clothing plays a huge part in aiding an actor to inhabit a character. Here, Dale Ferguson's design sketches depict classic Victorian silhouettes which form the foundation of An Ideal Husband's costume design.

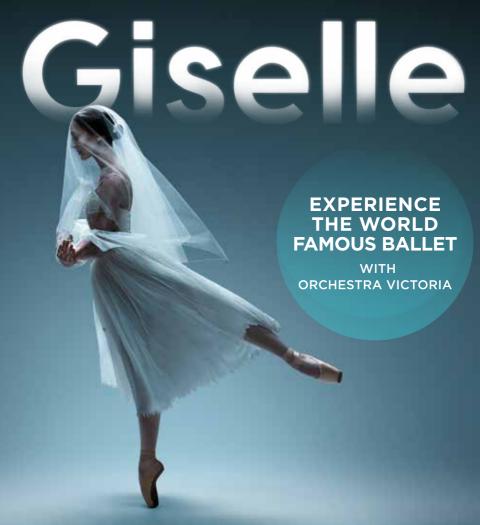

Mason / Mr Montford / Phipps

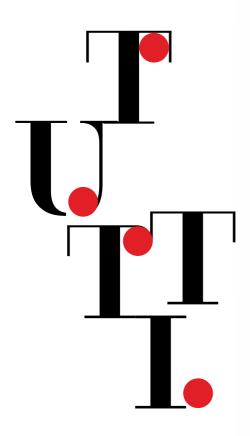

For Hayes Theatre Company he directed Assassins, Sweet Charity (Helpmann Award) and Little Shop of Horrors (Sydney Theatre Award); for Opera Australia Two Weddings, One Bride and Anything Goes (and GFO). Other credits include Once We Lived Here (London season), DreamSong (TheatreWorks), Straight (Red Stitch Actors' Theatre), The Last Five Years and five musicals for The Production Company. With composer Mathew Frank, he wrote Green Room award-winning musicals Prodigal and Once We Lived Here, as well as Virgins: A Musical Threesome, The Silver Donkey and an Amy Winehouse musical for Channel 10's Mr & Mrs Murder. Dean created verbatim piece Gaybies (Midsumma, Darlinghurst Theatre Company). Dean is Worldwide Associate Director of Priscilla, Oueen of the Desert - The Musical and is a graduate of WAAPA.



DALE FERGUSONSet & Costume Designer

Dale Ferguson's designs have been a regular feature of MTC productions, most recently in Di and Viv and Rose, Born Yesterday, Skylight, The Weir, The Speechmaker, Neighbourhood Watch, The Crucible, Top Girls, Summer of the Seventeenth Doll, Life Without Me, The Drowsy Chaperone, God of Carnage, August: Osage County, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, and The History Boys. Dale has worked for Australia's leading theatre companies, including Bell Shakespeare (King Lear), Gordon Frost Organisation (Anything Goes), Belvoir (The Blind Giant is Dancing), Malthouse Theatre (Night on Bald Mountain) and Sydney Theatre Company (Les Liaisons Dangereuses). He recently returned from designing Lyric Opera of Chicago's production of The Magic Flute. Dale has received five Green Room Awards, most recently for Malthouse Theatre in 2018, and the 2010 Helpmann Award for MTC's August: Osage County. His set and costume designs for Company B/Malthouse's production of Exit the King earned him Tony and Drama Desk Award nominations when the production transferred to Broadway in 2009.



MATT SCOTT Lighting Designer

Matt has received and been nominated for numerous awards, including a 2016 Green Room Award for The Pearlfishers (Opera Australia), a 2005 Helpmann Award for his lighting on Urinetown (MTC) and a 2003 Helpmann Award for The Blue Room (MTC).



MATHEW FRANK
Composer & Sound Designer

Mathew Frank was recently the composer and musical director of Born Yesterday, Skylight and Private Lives for Melbourne Theatre Company, as well as the musical director of Jerry's Girls, La Cage Aux Folles, The Pirates of Penzance, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Next to Normal and The Drowsy Chaperone. Mathew was the Associate Musical Director on the Company's production of Poor Boy, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee (and STC season), and Urinetown (and STC season). Other credits as Assistant Musical Director include The Sapphires, Britney Spears The Cabaret, Show People and Vinyl Viagra. With writing partner Dean Bryant, Mathew composed the musical Prodigal, which became the first Australian musical to be produced in New York City. It's off-Broadway debut was held at the York Theatre Company in 2002. Mathew's other original musicals include Virgins (A Musical Threesome), Once We Lived Here and The Silver Donkey.



LEITH McPHERSON Voice & Dialect Coach
